HOW TO APPLY FOR WORKFORCE TRAINING

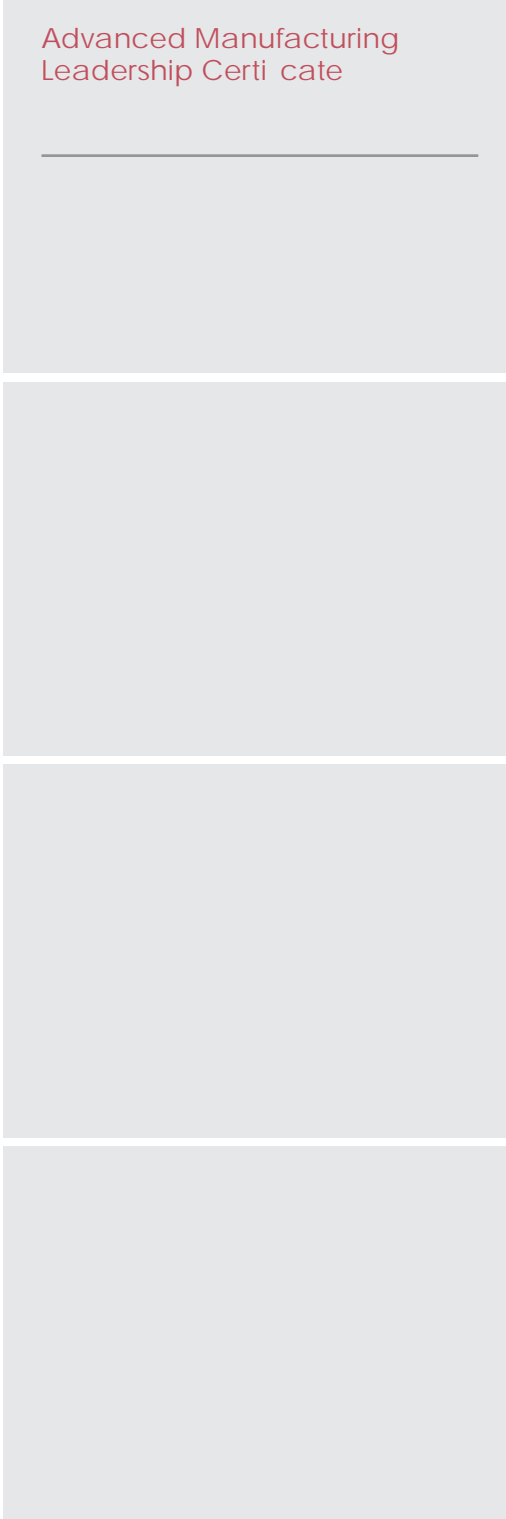
