
This introductory digital SLR photography series can be taken as individual courses for \$39, or together for only \$85!

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





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This four-week course covers the basic fundamentals of leadership, preparing emerging leaders in adopting a new role as employee-focused leaders. In-class activities will allow for handson experience on lessons learned during the course. Attendees will gain skill sets that will improve workplace communication, allowing employees to show more positive engagement, deeper commitment, and a stronger dedication to their jobs.

- · Employee motivation: Discover what drives employees, the key to effectively motivating and encouraging employees to achieve higher levels of performance. Inspire creativity in the hearts and minds of everyone in the team.


# ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANG AGE PROGRAM


