

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


Enrolling in Classes

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
CISCO NETWORKING ACADEMY



Any student enrolled in a day high school (regular or continuation) must meet the following criteria in order to take classes in MiraCosta's Adult High School: he/she must be a credit-de cient student, 16 years old or older, who has attended at least ve semesters of high school. Day high school students must also present a Concurrent Enrollment Permit signed by their day high school principal, counselor and parent. 

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



Those under 18 who can bene t from instruction are also allowed to enroll. Any student enrolled in a day high school (regular or continuation) must meet the following criteria in order to take classes in MiraCosta's Adult High School: he/she must be a credit-de cient student, 16 years old or older, who has attended at least ve semesters of high school. Day high school students must also present a Concurrent Enrollment Permit signed by their day high school principal, counselor and parent. The forms are available at high school counseling of ces, the Community Learning Center (CLC), MiraCosta's Admissions Of ces, and online at miracosta.edu/ahsdp.

In order to place students in courses that best meet their needs, individual skills will be assessed. English, reading, and math courses are also appropriate for persons who do not need a high school diploma but wish to increase their skills in preparation for college classes, for employment or advancement in the workplace, or for personal growth.

MiraCosta College will offer GED classes in the San Dieguito Union High School District (SDUHSD) for fall 2017.


